In November 1951 the Accounts Department was started with Mr. H.D. Brown in charge.


In February 1952 the Electric Accounting Machine assembly line went into operation with Mr. George Vanbellinghen of the French organization in charge of production. By this time we had 35 employees and were producing 25 Typewriters per month.

By July 1954 the personnel figure had risen to 510 and we were producing 200 Typewriters per month and a full range of Accounting Machines with manufacturing facilities to meet these programmes and our exports were averaging £30,000 per month.

On August 1st 1954 the removal of the plant and equipment took place from Battery Park to our new factory at Spango Valley.
